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An interview with our Patrons on the New Senior Secondary Curriculum and the Through-Train Policy at St. Mary's

The New Senior Secondary (NSS) curriculum in Hong Kong will bring unprecedented changes to the school system, making the learning experience of our younger sisters very different from older times. Moreover, the Through-Train mode will soon take effect. At this turning point, we are happy to have the opportunity to talk to our two Patrons, Ms. Catherine Wong, principal of St. Mary's Canossian College, and Ms. Maria Cheung, principal of St. Mary's Canossian School, to have them share their thoughts on such changes. Q: What is the rationale behind the Through-train mode, and how exactly will it be applied at St. Mary's?

Through-train education aims at strengthening the collaboration between primary and A: secondary schools having the same philosophy and aspiration for education. It aims to enhance continuity in the curriculum, strengthen the school's understanding of and support for its students, alleviate students' adaptation problems upon their promotion to the secondary school and realize the principle of "not giving up on any student".

With the approval of the Education Bureau, SMCC and her two feeder schools, SMCS and Holy Angels Canossian School (HACS), formally announced in 2004 their linkage to provide through-train education to Primary 1 students admitted to SMCS and HACS from 2005 onwards. This means that instead of admitting only 40 to 60% of Primary 6 (P6) graduates from these two feeder schools, starting from 2011 onwards, SMCC commits to admit all of them into Secondary 1 (S1).

Q: Why did St. Mary's choose to form through-train schools?

A: Our school's sponsoring body, Canossian Daughters of Charity, sees the through-train mode as an opportunity to fulfil its education mission. Under the through-train mode, collaboration between the primary and secondary schools will be strengthened, which in

turn will benefit the students' learning and full personal growth. St. Mary's is currently the only Government-aided English Medium of Instruction (EMI) school in Hong Kong that has adopted the through-train mode.

Q: Will the through-train mode make it difficult for SMCC to sustain its academic results?

A: Under the present Primary One Admission System, especially at the computer-programmed central allocation stage where students are allocated to us on a random basis, we actually have no say on which student to admit. Together with the elimination of the intense competition to get back into SMCC because of the through-train arrangement, the chance of having S1 students with diverse ability is expected. We therefore have to strive hard to raise the standard of English of our P6 students in order to meet the eligibility requirement to be an EMI school. To cope with this, we must let students know that it is their responsibility to learn, and to solicit cooperation from parents.

We understand very well that academic results should not be our sole focus in education. Instead, we aim at leading our students to strive towards their own excellence through the provision of a good learning environment. In SMCS and HACS, we have elite classes as well as remedial teaching arrangements to cater for students' diversified learning ability. In SMCC, we provide split classes, remedial and enhancement programmes for students whose attainment falls behind that of their classmates. For gifted students, the gifted programme offers plenty of opportunities in different disciplines to develop their talents.

Q: Will the NSS curriculum bring a lot of changes to St. Mary's?

A: First, while most subjects being offered are more or less the same, Liberal Studies will become a core subject instead of an elective subject, and is compulsory for all senior secondary students. Also, Principles of Accounts will be subsumed into a new subject called Business, Accounting & Financial Studies. Subjects that will be discontinued are Music and Psychology. Second, as one of the essential components of the NSS curriculum is Other Learning Experiences (OLE), which includes Moral and Civic Education, Aesthetic Development, Physical Development, Community Service and Career-related Experiences, and OLE needs to be allocated a fixed number of hours per week, we will plan our lessons in teaching weeks instead of teaching cycles with effect from September 2009.

Q: In what ways can we, as alumnae, provide support to our Alma Mater?

A: Under the Career-related Experiences of OLE, the school has to organize a range of work-related experiences for our senior secondary students, such as job attachment, job shadowing, business mentorship, career talks and workplace visits. If past St. Marians can offer these types of activities at their workplaces, it will definitely be of great help to us. We are also placing more emphasis on diversified learning to meet the needs of students with different abilities, including the demand for remedial and enhancement programmes. In addition, we see that the employment of additional Native-speaking English Teachers (NETs) can further enhance students' English proficiency. These arrangements will inevitably involve the usage of additional resources, and support from past St. Marians will be highly appreciated.

Interview with Retired Teacher & Alumna - Mrs. Alice Wong

Usually, when we say "a family of St. Marians", it means "a group of St. Marians". In this article, however, we don't simply mean that. We are referring to Mrs. Alice Wong Lau Kwan Hing, retired Chinese teacher and alumna, and her four other family members who had all studied at St. Mary's! We met with Mrs. Wong and two of these past St. Marians on a sunny Saturday afternoon over lunch.

"First, there were my eldest sister Lau Ka Foon and my third sister Lau Kwan Foon, who both graduated in the 1950's. I was quite a bit younger than my sisters and I graduated in

1967. Nevertheless, some teachers kept mistaking me for my sisters because of our similar names," laughed Mrs. Wong.

Three decades after that, her daughter Juliana studied in the class of 1997. Our jaws dropped when we realized that Juliana's cousin Maria Lui, daughter of her third aunt Lau Kwan Foon, was also a St. Marian! "My aunt's family resides in the States now, but whenever they

visit, we often talk about our alma mater," said Juliana.

Of course they did. Before Mrs. Wong's retirement in 2008, she had been Chinese Language and P.E. teacher at St. Mary's Canossian School for 30 years, and had thoroughly enjoyed her work. "With my personal experience in SMCC and that learnt from my two elder sisters, I believe in the Canossian spirit, and am happy to be able to pass that spirit on to the younger generation," shared Mrs. Wong.

Over the years, apart from her teaching work, Mrs. Wong was also instrumental in training our primary school students to participate in the Hong Kong Speech Festival. "I enjoyed doing that because I saw how the students benefit from the experience," said Mrs. Wong. "Through story-telling, dialogues and sight-readings, they become much more confident and eloquent in their presentation. This would help them a lot in the long run," said Mrs. Wong. "And it's certainly rewarding seeing them win in competitions," added Mrs. Wong with a proud smile.

Juliana recalled that she had also participated in the Speech Festival during her school days. "I was fortunate to be coached by mom both at school and at home. But as one can imagine, this can mean quite a bit of pressure at times," she laughed.

Back in the challenging days of the 1950's, there were not many extra-curricular activities for students. "We were all very focused on our studies," recalled the elderly yet spirited Lau Ka Foon, who is also a retired teacher. "Not many girls had the opportunity to study at the time. That's why we took it much more seriously. It was the path to better one's life, and the girls really treasured school life," she explained.

Lau Ka Foon was student in the Chinese section, and was amongst the first batch of students to take part in the Chinese School Certificate Examination in Hong Kong. "If I remember correctly, that was in 1952. There were about 30 classmates in my class. On the day of the exam, we all gathered outside the school chapel in the morning, and the sisters and teachers prayed with us. Then a school bus came to take us all to the exam venue," she recalled.

That was indeed a historical time. The three St. Marians in this family had witnessed the development of St. Mary's in more than half a century. Do they notice any common traits among St. Marians at different times? "I would say St. Marians tend to be smart, diligent and conscientious," said Mrs. Wong. "These are great virtues that the Canossian sisters have

instilled in us, for which we are truly thankful."

And how is Mrs. Wong spending her time now? "It takes me some time getting used to retirement life," said Mrs. Wong. "The other day, I saw some interesting cheering dances on TV, and I immediately thought about how I could bring that back to my students! Then I remember that I'm already retired!" she laughed.

forward to spending some quality time with Mr. Wong after all these years. I totally enjoy my post-retirement life; there are so many activities that I'd like to take part in. And the best of all is, I can sleep till mid-day now!" Mrs. Wong bursted into laughter again.

It was indeed an unusual experience for us to meet with this family of St. Marians. The three of them, though at different stages of their lives, were equally affectionate, energetic and bubbly. On behalf of all St. Marians, may we take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Alice Wong for her three decades of teaching, and wish her all the best in her future plans!

School News - Mentorship Programme 2008-09

The Mentorship Programme was first launched in November 2004. It aims to provide a means for past St. Marians to share their experience and professional knowledge with F6 students in order to better prepare them for their future.

This year, the plan has evolved a little. Mentors and mentees will be organized into larger



groups (2-3 mentors to 6-8 mentees) so that students may learn more from a few mentors who will, in turn, be able to shoulder amongst themselves the responsibility of taking care of the mentees throughout the year. It is hoped that both the mentors and mentees will benefit more from this small group structure, as there will be more dynamic and wider sharing of experience, interests and fun.

Over 90 past students have signed up as mentors this year. There will be eight sector/industry groupings - Art, Culture & Media / Engineering, Manufacturing, Utilities, IT & Internet / Finance, Banking & Insurance / Legal / Management & Human

Resources / Marketing, Advertising & PR / Medical, Health & Nursing / Professional Services, Education, Government & NGO.

The first mentor-mentee gathering will take place on 21 February 2009 (Sat), while the school has also set aside 3 April 2009 (Fri) to hold Careers Development Seminars for F6 students.

"On behalf of the school, I would like to thank all the mentors for their generous contribution of time and expertise towards the growth and development of our F6 students," said Ms. Amelia Tsang, Vice Principal of SMCC. "Such experience for our students is profoundly invaluable."
