## Message from our Patron Ms. Catherine Wong, Principal of SMCC

Dear Alumnae,

Here at St. Mary's, we are into a challenging academic year!

First and foremost, this is the double cohort year whereby every school has the last group of F.7 students doing the Advanced Level and the first group of F.6 students doing the Diploma of Education Examinations. With 39 classes the school campus does look a little more crowded, especially during morning assembly gatherings. As with all schools, F.6 students and teachers are faced with undue pressure, induced by the new academic structure, so everyone has to work extremely hard and be more supportive of one another!

Another big challenge is that our Through Train has finally arrived. Now, all primary pupils from our two feeders, St. Mary's and Holy Angel's Canossian Schools, automatically enter the secondary without screening. We expect a certain impact caused by the student intake. To be better prepared for a smooth transition, principals and teachers of the three schools have been working closely for the past few years, seeing to every aspect, from academics to co-curricular activities and student quality. The teachers of the feeder schools have put in a lot of effort in raising academic standards and helping the pupils do their best. We had a small inauguration ceremony during the Orientation Day for new students and their parents to mark the beginning of the endeavour.

There certainly is a much wider diversity in academic ability in our new F.1 students with a range of interests and talents to be explored and developed! With our ground work and our adoption of various strategies, teachers are doing their best with the understanding that some newcomers would need a longer period than others to rise up to the rigorous academic requirements. One thing we notice at this point in time is that we are encouraged by their good behaviour! As Sr. Cynthia our Supervisor said, we have to change our mind set and efforts from 教「好學生」到教好「學生」!

We believe that God is with us in every step of our way. Following the footsteps of our Foundress, with "One Heart and One Way", we strive to make the impossible possible. We continue to live by our vision: "It is God's greatest glory that each and every St. Marian will be honoured and distinguished as she is and what she can become."

## Message from our Patron Ms. Maria Cheung, Principal of SMCS

Dear St. Marians,

God's joy be with you all!

As always, I would like to update you with the current events of the primary school. I'm sure you know that September, the beginning of a new academic year, is a challenge for our Primary one pupils. But it is a challenge for our new teachers as well.

This year we have eight new staff, including five teachers, one librarian and two janitors. In order for them to adapt and cope with the new environment, we provide them with professional guidance and support through an induction system which involves senior teachers and peer groups.

As for our new Primary One pupils, there is the "Big Sisters Scheme" run by our Discipline and Counselling Team during the first two months of school. For them, physical locations are challenging! They get easily confused with the direction going to the washroom, the library, the general office, the music room, etc. It is not uncommon for a Primary One pupil to approach me during recess and tells me that she wants to go back to "her kindergarten"! This new life is really stressful for her.

This year, we continue to focus on learning diversity in order to enhance the quality and effectiveness of classroom teaching and learning. And starting from September 2012, Primary One of SMCS will adopt Small Class Teaching approach, which is also coherent to our "Through Train" development. We believe that this will bring enormous benefit to the pupils by enhancing their learning capacity.

Another important issue is to create an environment for the pupils "to learn for the future". In order to achieve this purpose, we research resources for curriculum and teacher development. This year, we are grateful to have subsidy from the Quality Education Fund to run a project named "Developing Teaching and Assessment Strategies of Higher Order Thinking Skills in General Studies". A core team is set up to facilitate this program. Regular co-planning sessions are arranged at different levels to implement this theme.

Last but not least, we all know that teaching also involves helping pupils acquire social skills and a proper attitude towards events in life. Hence we encourage interaction and active pupil participation in various school activities. Now, with IT facilities, the learning experience in the classroom is quite different from the time when you were in St. Mary's. Pupils are expected to learn not only from the teachers, but also from their peers and the Internet. Our goal is that when this new generation of St. Marians step out into the real world, they will be ready to cope with their new environment and are prepared to meet new challenges.

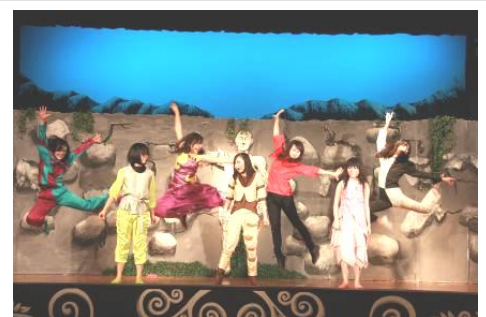

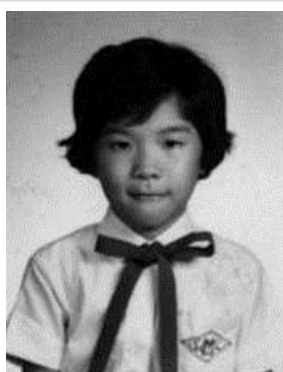
## Alumna Feature – Prof. Nancy Ip

*“Persevere and be prepared to pursue your dreams with focused enthusiasm and drive.”*

Probably few of us would ever attempt to understand how nerve cells communicate with each other. Yet, this is a major research focus of Prof. Nancy Ip, a St. Marian who was guided by her passion to pursue studies on the other side of the Pacific, at a time when woman scientists were rare. Prof. Ip spent the early part of her scientific career in the US. After obtaining her PhD. degree in pharmacology in Harvard, she continued her scientific training as a postdoctoral fellow at Harvard and Sloan-Kettering Institute in New York. Thereafter, she left the academia to work as a Senior Staff Scientist at Regeneron Pharmaceuticals Inc. Prof. Ip returned to Hong Kong in 1993, and is now one of few internationally acclaimed woman life scientists.

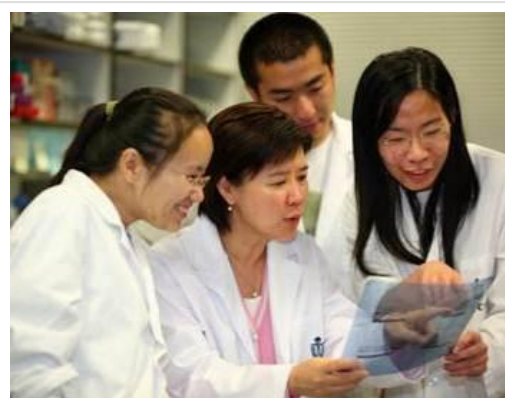

The youngest of five girls of the Ip's family, all of whom are St Marians, Prof. Ip was once a student of her eldest sister in primary school. Prof. Ip's 13 years at St Mary's made such an impact on her that the footage of the school was included in one of her video interviews in 2004 when she was honored with the "L'Oreal-UNESCO for Women in Science Award". The interview can be viewed [here](#)\*. This is a prestigious international award which honours accomplished woman scientists around the world, and is considered to be comparable to the Nobel Prize, except that it focuses solely on women.

Currently Dean of Science, Chair Professor of the Division of Life Science, and Director of the State Key Laboratory of Molecular Neuroscience at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Prof Ip's expertise and efforts are well recognised all over the world :

- First Chinese Laureate of the L'Oreal-UNESCO for Women in Science Award
  - First international member being elected Councilor of the Society for Neuroscience
  - Elected Councilor of the Collegium Internationale Neuro-Psychopharmacologicum
  - Academician of the Chinese Academy of Sciences
- and the list goes on ...

So isn't the US a better place for top-notch scientists to make further advancements? One of the main reasons Prof. Ip returned to this part of the world was to help educate the next generation of scientists in Hong Kong and Mainland China, where her roots lie. It gives her great pleasure and joy as she sees young men and women maturing into scientists. Prof. Ip is also delighted to learn that St. Marians continue to develop girls into solid and well-rounded young ladies, although she would like to see more of them enter the science field.

## Teacher's News - Mr. Philip Lee

History does repeat itself. Mr. Philip Lee won a national award a year ago - First Place Grand Award at the 25<sup>th</sup> China Adolescents Science & Technology Innovation Contest (Teaching Aid) [第二十五屆全國青少年科技創新大賽(科教製作)一等獎], and he won another award this year - First Prize (Teaching Aids for Teachers) of the Hong Kong Youth Science and Technology Invention Competition 2010-11 [香港青少年科技創新大賽2010-11(教師教具發明)]一等獎] with the project title of Micro Gravitation Experiments.

Launched in 1997, the "Hong Kong Youth Science and Technology Invention Competition" is now the largest and most popular science competition in Hong Kong with nearly 10,000 applicants from over 300 schools participating in this annual event. Don't let the word "youth" in the title mislead you - it does have a section for teachers. And of course that's the prize won by Mr. Lee!

We are grateful for Mr. Lee's commitment to teaching all these years, and are so happy to see his enthusiasm repeatedly rewarded with great recognition. Mr. Lee has set a good example in accepting new challenges. It shouldn't be long before we see the young generations of St. Marians receiving similar honours.

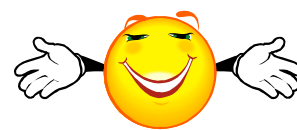
## Class Reunion News

## Guidelines for Past Students Planning to Visit the Campus

Our Alma Mater always welcomes visits from us. However, due to school hours and the many other activities taking place on campus these days, it would be great if past students can follow these guidelines when planning a visit. These guidelines are also posted on our website for reference.



### 1. When is a good time to visit St. Mary's?

The School is open during school days and on Saturdays, and closed on Sundays and public holidays. Preferred visiting hours are:

*Note: If you're visiting during class hours, please do not go near classroom areas or students having their P.E. lessons/activities on the playground to avoid disturbing the students.*

### 2. Who should I contact in advance if I want to visit St. Mary's?

### 3. Which entrance should I use to get into St. Mary's? Do I need to register?

You can come in either through the Austin Road entrance or the Kimberley Road entrance. The janitor at the entrance will request you to write your name, year of graduation and mobile phone number on the Log Book. If you have made a prior arrangement with the school for the visit, please let the janitor know so that she can inform the School Office accordingly.

### 4. I happen to be in the neighborhood, can I come into the school for a visit without any prior arrangement?

While alumnae are always welcome to visit their alma mater, the timing may sometimes be inconvenient for unannounced visits because the campus is often loaded with activities. Hence, the School encourages prior arrangements in order to avoid disappointments. If you happen to be in the neighborhood and would like to make a visit, please check with the janitor at the entrance to see if the time is convenient. If not, kindly arrange another time with the staff contacts listed above.

### 5. Sometimes I notice that the school is open during non-school hours. Can I come in for a visit?

Occasionally, you may find the school playground open on Sundays, public holidays or evenings during non-school hours. This is because part of the campus might be borrowed by the Rosary

Church or Government bodies for other purposes. While it might be possible for you to get into the school at those hours, we do not recommend you walk around as most part of the school would be closed due to security and safety reasons. We do not want to put the janitors into difficult positions as they are unable to liaise with the General Office during those hours.

**6. Can I take photos on campus during my visit?**

Feel free to take photos on campus during your visit, but for courtesy and privacy reasons, please do not take photos of the students, unless you have their explicit consent to do so. In addition, please note that the photos taken cannot be used for any commercial purposes.

**7. I'm planning a gathering. Can I book the campus as venue?**

While the School welcomes alumnae for visits, the campus cannot be made available for private events or functions due to its busy schedule and other security and safety concerns.

**8. If I drive, can I park my car at school?**

Unless prior arrangement has been made, visitors are not allowed to park on campus as that may interfere with school and student activities. Kindly make use of the car parks nearby for your parking needs.
