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Message from the Executive Committee St. Mary's PSA has turned a new page!

The year 2013 marks many new changes to St. Mary's and her various stakeholders. As a major step to put in force the School-based Management Policy under the Education Ordinance (Cap. 279) in Hong Kong, all Hong Kong primary and secondary schools are required to set up their own Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) within the year to manage the school. The IMC will consist of the principal, appointed representatives from the school sponsoring body, elected representatives from teachers, parents and alumni, as well as an appointed independent person, who will all become managers of the school.


"The Past Students' Association of St. Mary's Canossian College and St. Mary's Canossian School" "St. Mary's Past Students' Association"

Under the new Constitution, the name of our Association remains as "St. Mary's Past Students' Association", alongside a new name in long form as "The Past Students' Association of St. Mary's Canossian College and St. Mary's Canossian School". The long form will be used primarily in IMC-related communications.

St. Mary's Past Students' Association (SMPSA), being the official alumni body for both St. Mary's Canossian College (SMCC, secondary school) and St. Mary's Canossian School (SMCS, primary school), has been tasked with the preparation and implementation of the election of the Alumni Managers for the two schools. However, as the original membership of the SMPSA consists of alumni from both SMCC and SMCS, it was necessary for us to re-organise the structure of the SMPSA so as to comply with Section 40AP of the Education Ordinance, that is, only the alumni of the respective schools may elect or become office-bearers of the bodies processing the Alumni Manager elections.

This was the top priority for the SMPSA Executive Committee elected at the Annual General Meeting on 16 March 2013 to focus on after settling in. During the following months we worked closely with the management of both schools to revise the structure, the name, and hence the Constitution of the SMPSA. We drafted the regulations for the election of the alumni managers and helped the schools to computerize their respective alumni database. We also held two Extraordinary General Meetings on 22 June and 20 July 2013 respectively to present and adopt all related documents, and to re-elect office bearers of the SMPSA under the new structure.

Now, with all the restructuring completed and changes recognized by the school sponsorsing respective body, we are preparing for the nomination and election of the respective Alumni Manager for the IMC of SMCC and SMCS to be held before the end of November 2013. More information on the coming nomination and election exercise is presented on the inside pages of this newsletter. Stay tuned!

The diagram above shows the difference between the old and the new structure of the SMPSA. Under the new structure, two Councils (one for SMCC and one for SMCS) have been formed, with members being past students of the respective schools. Council members will handle school-specific matters, including Alumni Manager election, and they have also joined to form the Executive Committee of the SMPSA.

Nomination and Election of the Alumni Managers of the respective Incorporated Management Committees of SMCC and SMCS

In accordance with Section 40AP of the Education Ordinance (Cap. 279), the Canossian Missions, the sponsoring body of both St Mary's Canossian College (SMCC) and St. Mary's Canossian School (SMCS), recognizes the St. Mary's Past Students' Association (SMPSA) as the alumni body for the purpose of nominating Alumni Managers for the respective Incorporated Management Committees (IMC) of SMCC and SMCS. The PSA Executive Committee has taken on board the task to prepare for the nomination and election of alumni manager following the two Extraordinary General Meetings held in June and July this year to adopt the documents to facilitate the work. The nomination period will officially **start on 26 October until 9 November 2013** (both dates inclusive). The nomination form, signed by one alumni proposer and one alumni seconder, must be delivered in person/by hand to the Election Post Box located at the General Office of the respective schools before the deadline.

The timeline governing the nomination and election is briefly set out for your easy reference:

26 October

- Official launch of the nomination period
- Official election notice uploaded onto the SMPSA website

9 November

- Close of Nomination

11 November

- Announcement of the names of candidates on the SMPSA website

23 November

- Polling Day (from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm at St. Mary's Canossian College)

Watch out for the election notice and other related documents including but not limited to the duties of the IMC and the alumni manager; regulations and procedures for nomination and election; nomination form etc. on the SMPSA website accessible at http://www.stmaryspsa.org/election starting from 26 October 2013. All alumni of SMCC and SMCS aged eighteen or above on the date of nomination are eligible to be candidates/proposers/seconders/voters in the coming election. As regards the verification of the eligibility of the alumni, records held by SMCC and SMCS shall be final.

Do support this first-ever election of alumni manager and nominate past students around who show their readiness to serve SMCC and SMCS for the betterment of the schools and students!

Construction of the new Multi-purpose Activity Room

While many structures still remain unchanged, the school campus does undergo redevelopment all the time. In 1998, the area that was once the badminton court and the bungalows of the Chemistry Lab and the Physics Lab, was converted into the 5-storey Magdalene Building to provide more classrooms for use. A decade later, space was running out again to accommodate the diversified array of student activities, and a plan was made to convert the covered playground at the ground level of the Magdalene Building into a Multi-purpose Activity Room which can accommodate up to 200 students, ideal for holding seminars and talks. Three types of installations are needed to make the room a fully functional one. First, folding glass doors have to be built to enclose the area. Then, an air-conditioning system and an audio-visual system will have to be installed.

In the summer of 2013, the folding doors were constructed, funded by the Government. With a generous donation of HK\$150,000 from past St. Marian Ms. Lily Au, the School has also secured a large portion of the funds needed for the installation of the air-conditioning system. At the moment, the School is looking for contributions towards the balance sum for funding the installation of air-conditioning system, as well as that for setting up an audio-visual system. The award was launched in 2003-04 recognise teachers who demonstrate exemplary teaching practices and facilitate sharing of good teaching practices. The award focuses on different key learning areas each year, and the focus of the 2012-13 award are "Guidance and Discipline", "Science Education Key
